From the Foredeck

Rear Commodore for Sail James Ramsey



Welcome to February and the start of our 2025 sailing regatta season. There are three important items for all skippers as we delve into the season: first is

knowing the racing calendar; second is your vessel's PHRF rating; third and most important is knowing how to sign up for the individual regattas.

Proposed regattas from all clubs are sent to our Hawaii Yacht Racing Association (HYRA) board where schedules are deconflicted and a calendar is formed. This calendar is located on the front page of the HYRA website which can be accessed via the hyperlink on our WYC site in the sailing section. The first event on this year's calendar is Opening Day on Saturday 2/15/25. This regatta is a joint venture acting as opening day for both WYC and HYC that includes a pre-race boat blessing, a great time on the water, and a fantastic post-race party at WYC. This regatta is not part of a race series but instead is focused on bringing sailors together to celebrate and strengthen our sailing community.

Sailing is fun on it's own but racing for a HYRA trophy can generate more excitement and give purpose. To receive a HYRA trophy, you must qualify by participating in the series points regattas associated and have a valid Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (PHRF) rating. Hawaii uses the Northern California PHRF rating which are simple to obtain. You do so by visiting the Yacht Racing Associating (YRA) site at https://yra.org/ncphrf/ where you can follow the links to obtain a new certificate if you haven't raced your vessel or renew your old/existing one. Because we race in Hawaii, the cost is minimal, and the certificate is valid for the entire season. This task was a bit daunting to me when I first registered s/v

Zephyr, but I was able to lean on other skippers and sailors for guidance, the same guidance I will offer to anyone who has questions on the process. If you want to participate in regattas but not for a trophy, you are still allowed to enter most regattas using a temporary rating. I encourage everyone to obtain a PHRF rating so you can represent WYC at the end of year HYRA awards but if competing for one isn't for you, I still encourage your regatta participation.

Now that you know the schedule and understand PHRF rating requirements, our last action is registering your boat for the regatta(s). Most HYRA regattas have an online signup through Regatta Network https:// www.regattanetwork.com/ . You'll be able to access the individual event information on Regatta Network which includes Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SI) which will inform you of the type of regatta that event is. Signing up is straightforward but there are occasional technical difficulties. If you run into any issues signing up, don't hesitate to reach out, I want to ensure everyone that wants to sign up gets to.

Equipped with this information, I hope that everyone is more excited and empowered to participate in the 2025 racing season. If you see me in the club, feel free to stop me and ask questions, you elected me to this position of service and it's my pleasure to grow our sailing community.



General Manager's Message

Every two years, the Club Leaders Forum Advisory Board conducts a survey of all private clubs in America and recognizes the most distinguished

clubs with status of 5-Star Platinum Club of America. This is a coveted award based on seven criteria and voted on by over 4,000 Club Presidents, Commodores, GM/COOs and CEOs nationwide. In the Yacht Club category, the top 30 clubs receive this distinction followed by 20 that earn Honorable Mention. For the first time, Waikiki Yacht Club was selected in Honorable Mention category for 2025-2026. The seven criteria are:

- 1. Universal Recognition
- 2. Excellence in Amenities and Facilities
- 3. Caliber of Staff and Professional Service Levels
- 4. Engagement and Commitment of Membership
- 5. Governance and Prudent Fiscal Management
- 6. Adapting to Changing Times
- 7. The Overall Experience

Over the next two years, the Board of Directors and management team have committed to working hard and earning our spot in the top 30. With the support of membership, we look forward to being recognized nationwide as a 5-Star Platinum Club of America in 2027-2028.

Last month, in keeping with their fiduciary responsibilities, the Board of Directors voted to moderately increase fees throughout the club. The food & beverage (F&B) minimum will increase from \$330 semi-annually to \$300 quarterly, effective February 1, 2025. This will affect all membership categories that are subject to F&B minimums. Member billing will be prorated for the first three months through March 31st. Switching to quarterly minimums will encourage members to frequent the club more often, and in turn help us reduce overhead costs. Please consider us for hosting special events at the club: birthday parties; anniversaries; weddings; date nights or any significant event, they all count towards your quarterly minimum.

The board approved an annual 5% increase in dues, in line with the 5-year plan adopted in 2023 to keep membership dues aligned with increases in operating costs and to mitigate the need for significant "one-time increases", for all categories except junior members effective April 1, 2025.

Beginning February 1st, the club is implementing a 20% upcharge for all visitors and non-member guests purchasing food, beverage or merchandise. This will include reciprocal members from other yacht clubs and guests paying with guest cards. Members who pay for their guests by credit card or through their member accounts will not be subject to the guest upcharge fee.

In keeping with the vision of Commodore Buelsing, there are some great projects to look forward to beginning this spring. This includes fresh paint and new furnishings in our dining room, new landscaping and trophy case repairs, along with a new wharf deck, which will give our facility a much needed (and cost-effective) makeover. These projects will take place throughout the year and along with them, we look forward to increasing our member services, the professionalism of the club staff, and elevating the overall member experience.

Throughout 2024, our team consistently performed at the top, securing numerous accolades throughout the year.


As we look to 2025, our goals are to strengthen our competitive edge, grow as athletes, and provide more travel opportunities for our team.



Inspired by Duke Kahanamoku's legacy, we integrate Hawaiian cultural teachings and language into our practices.



Boating Safety Refresher: Getting Ready for Spring everyone onboard, including childre

As spring approaches, WYC members are gearing up for another exciting boating season on the beautiful waters of Hawai'i. Whether planning a leisurely sail, participating in club races, or enjoying the camaraderie of our boating community, taking time to refresh your boating safety knowledge and prepare your vessel ensures a smooth and enjoyable experience for all.

Inspect Your Safety Equipment

Start by checking your safety gear. All life jackets should be U.S. Coast Guard-approved, in good condition, and correctly sized for each passenger. For family outings or club events, ensure you have enough life jackets for

everyone onboard, including children. Emergency gear, such as flares, fire extinguishers, and first aid kits, should be inspected and replaced if outdated. Many of our WYC members participate in sunset or evening sails, so doublecheck that your navigation lights are functioning properly. These lights are essential for visibility and compliance with local maritime regulations.

Prepare Your Vessel

Maintaining your vessel is key to a safe and enjoyable season. Schedule a professional engine check to address any wear and tear from previous outings. Replace damaged parts, check fuel, and oil levels, and ensure the cooling system is functioning properly. For sailboats, inspect rigging, lines, and sails for any signs of wear or damage. Take time to examine the hull for cracks, leaks, or other structural issues, and make necessary repairs before hitting the water. Test your boat's batteries to ensure they are fully charged and securely connected, and verify that electrical systems, including bilge pumps, are in good working order.

Review Safety Protocols and Local Regulations

Boating around Waikiki comes with its unique set of challenges, from busy harbor traffic to sudden weather changes. Familiarize yourself with local navigation rules, such as channel markers, speed limits, and restricted areas near the Ala Wai Harbor. Participating in WYC races or cruises? Protect yourself from the tropical sun with sunscreen, hats, and hydration, as sun exposure can lead to fatigue and dehydration.

Enhance Your Boating Skills

WYC offers a wealth of opportunities to improve your boating knowledge and skills. Whether you are a seasoned sailor or a beginner, consider enrolling in a safety course or joining one of the club's training sessions. Learn more about navigation, knot-tying, and docking techniques to enhance your confidence on the water. Use the quieter pre-season period to practice docking or maneuvering at Ala Wai Harbor, especially if you have acquired a new vessel or want to refine your handling skills.

Share Your Float Plan

Informing a fellow club member, friend, or family member of your float plan is an essential safety measure. Share details about your planned route, estimated return time, and who to contact in case of delays. This simple step ensures someone knows where to look if unexpected circumstances arise.

Foster a Culture of Safety at the Club

As a valued member of the WYC, you play a vital role in promoting a culture of safety. Share tips with fellow members, participate in club safety briefings and encourage everyone to prioritize preparedness. A wellprepared boating community ensures individual safety and strengthens our shared commitment to the joy of being on the water.
